Amarone

Amarone della Valpolicella is a typically rich Italian dry red wine made from the partially-dried grapes of the Corvina varietal. The final result is a very ripe, raisiny, full-bodied wine with very little acid. This varietal is one of Italy's most cherished and beloved works of Italian wine.

Sangiovese

Although primarily known as the classic grape of Chianti, Sangiovese loves to show its versatility and grace wherever it is grown. It continues to prove why it is one of the Italian Big 3 (along with Nebbiolo and Barbera) by producing wines that range from huge, bold, and velvety to light, ripe, and fruity. Bella!

Brunello

First cultivated in the 19th century by Ferruccio Biondi Santi, today Brunello di Montalcino are the greatest expressions of Tuscan Sangiovese. Compared to "Chianti on steroids," Brunellos are big, intense, and complex. This is truly the finest of Italy's varietals.

Barbera

A red Italian wine grape variety that, as of 2000, was the third most-planted red grape variety in Italy (after Sangiovese and Montepulciano)

Syrah/Shiraz

People often ask "Why do the Australians call it 'Shiraz' when everyone else in the world calls it 'Syrah'?" The answer is simple. They're Australian! And they do make some tasty Shiraz.

Malbec

Originally a common grape in Bordeaux, France. Malbec adds only a small percentage to the blends there. It has, however, found another region in which to flourish—the burgeoning wine region of Argentina. In fact, Argentinians have adopted Malbec as their national grape!

Barolo

Barolo is a red wine produced in the Northern Italian region of Piemonte. It is made from the Nebbiolo grape and is often described as one of Italy's greatest wines. In Piemonte, the wines are often paired with meat dishes, heavy pastas and rich risottos; the tannins bind to the food proteins and produce a soft finish.
